## Kau Kau Korner is Back!

APRICOT SQUARES by BJ Rodrigues

Preheat oven @ 350 degrees

Mix dry ingredients all together
1 1/2 cup all purpose flour
1 1/2 cup Quaker oak cereal (quick

1 1/2 cup Quaker oak cereal (quick cooking 1 or 2 min)

1 1/2 cup chopped walnuts 1/2 tsp baking soda

1/4 tsp salt

In separate Ig bowl

Melt/micro wave 1 cup butter (2 sticks)

add 2/3 cup brown sugar and mix together Add the above mixed dry ingredients and mix with fork.

Set aside 1 1/4 cup of the mixture.

Put mixture in a 9 X 13 baking pan or / glass pan

Pat down mixture with fingers or fork Spread 1 jar (12 oz ) Apricot Pineapple preserve on mixture

Top with the 1 1/4 cup mixture that was set aside bake for 30 to 35 minutes - bottom and top should be slightly brown let it cool then cut into squares.
